

## \$0 Copay for Select Maintenance Medications

Plan members pay \$0 copay for generic maintenance medications used to treat asthma, depression, diabetes, heart disease/high blood pressure, and high cholesterol when filled at In-House, Community Partner, or Home Delivery pharmacies. Formulary vial insulins and blood glucose testing supplies are also included!
